SUMMARY OF THE PAST DEKAD 11-04-2025 TO 20-04-2025

A cloud band that entered the country from the west resulted in cloudy conditions and scattered thunderstorm activity across the country though some areas did not receive rainfall. Notable cumulative amounts recorded were 183mm (Chibero), 106mm (Chisengu), 96mm (Binga), 90mm (Wedza), 77mm (Mukandi), 62mm (Belvedere), 55mm (Henderson), 52mm (Makoholi) and 50mm (Gweru). The rest of the amounts recorded was below 49mm. A north-easterly airflow prevailed across much of the country, while a south-easterly flow dominated in Midlands, Manicaland and Masvingo Provinces. The south-easterly airflow was particularly persistent over Midlands, Manicaland and Masvingo Provinces throughout the week due to a high-pressure system that was over the South east coast of the subcontinent. Morning temperatures remained mild, rising to warm conditions during the afternoon. Conditions remained favourable for vegetation growth across most regions.

SOIL WATER INDEX AND WATER REQUIREMENT SATISFACTION INDEX




Figure 1: Soil Water Index (SWI) and Water Requirement Satisfaction Index (Courtesy of USGS FEWSNET).

Maize crops across the country are in the late maturation to harvest stage supported by consistent rainfall throughout the season. By the end of the dekad, water availability was generally adequate nationwide. The northern regions had good to very good water satisfaction levels for maize, while the southern areas ranged from mediocre to average. However, reservoirs and surface water bodies have stored enough water overall. The Soil Water Index indicates that the far eastern and southern regions had lower soil moisture than ideal for maize growth. This was due to slightly higher potential evapotranspiration demand compared to the north, which showed a mix of stress and adequate soil moisture levels.

WEATHER OUTLOOK: 21-30 APRIL 2025




Figure 2: Accumulated precipitation for the period 21-04-2025 to 30-04-2025

Scattered thunders showers are anticipated in the parts of the country with rainfall amounts exceeding 15mm anticipated in some places especially in places such as Victoria Falls and Binga where rainfall amounts ranging between 15-23mm are expected. It is probable to have isolated heavier falls in some places. Isolated light showers are still expected in the eastern parts with rainfall amounts below 5mm are expected. The showers should be attributed to the moisture expected from the western of the country during the forecast period.

AGROMET ADVISORY

- Keep updated weather wise so for informed decisions in day-to-day activity.
- Moisture Utilization: Light, isolated showers provide limited soil moisture.
 Farmers should prioritize water conservation techniques (mulching, drip irrigation)
 for crops in early growth stages
- **Heat Management:** Rising afternoon temperatures may stress livestock and young crops. Ensure shade provision for animals and timely watering (early morning/late evening to reduce evaporation.
- **Light Rain/Drizzle:** While moisture is minimal, it can aid germination of winter cereals (wheat, barley). Farmers should monitor soil moisture for planting timing.
