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SUMMARY OF PAST WEEK: 05 NOVEMBER – 11 NOVEMBER 2025

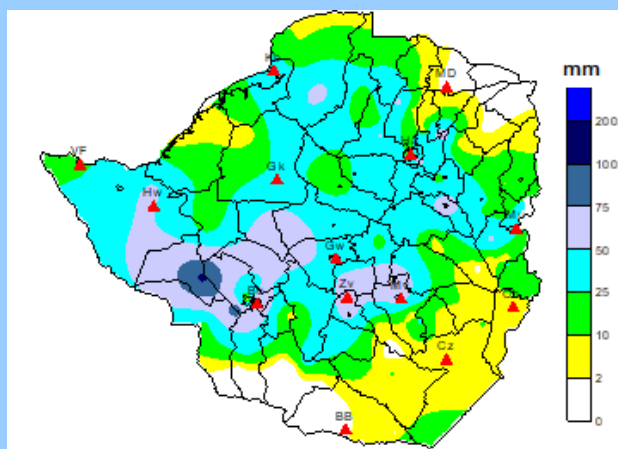


FIGURE 1: WEEKLY RAINFALL TOTALS: 05 NOVEMBER -11 NOVEMBER 2025

The week under review was predominantly wet and warm, with mostly cloudy conditions and widespread rain and showers across most of the country (Figure 1). Weekly rainfall totals exceeded 10 mm in most areas, with the exceptions of parts of Masvingo, Matabeleland South, and Mashonaland East Provinces.

SEASONAL ACCUMULATED RAINFALL: 01 OCTOBER 2025 – 11 NOVEMBER 2025

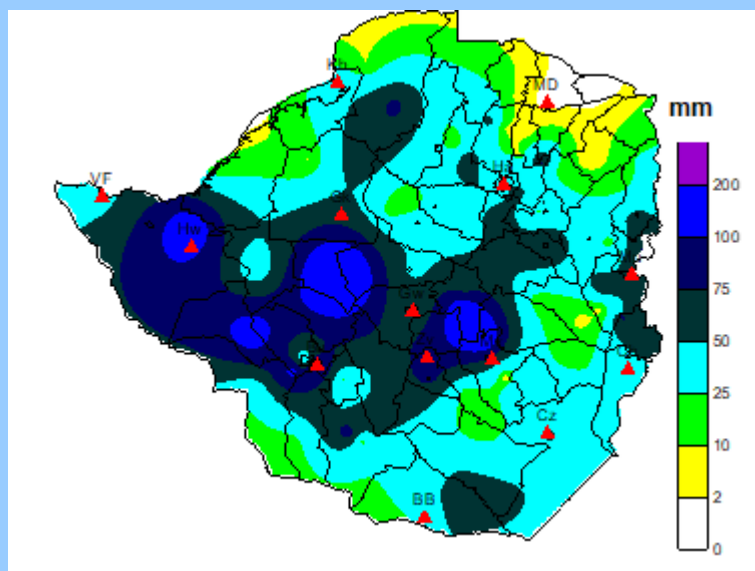


FIGURE 2: SEASONAL RAINFALL TOTALS: 01 OCTOBER -11 NOVEMBER 2025

Most of the country has received less than 50 mm of cumulative rainfall since 01 October 2025 (Figure 2). Higher totals exceeding 50 mm were confined to central Manicaland, Midlands, Matabeleland North and South Provinces, and the central watershed (royal blue pockets). Parts of Mount Darwin and Rushinga districts in Mashonaland Central have received minimal precipitation, totaling less than 2 mm.

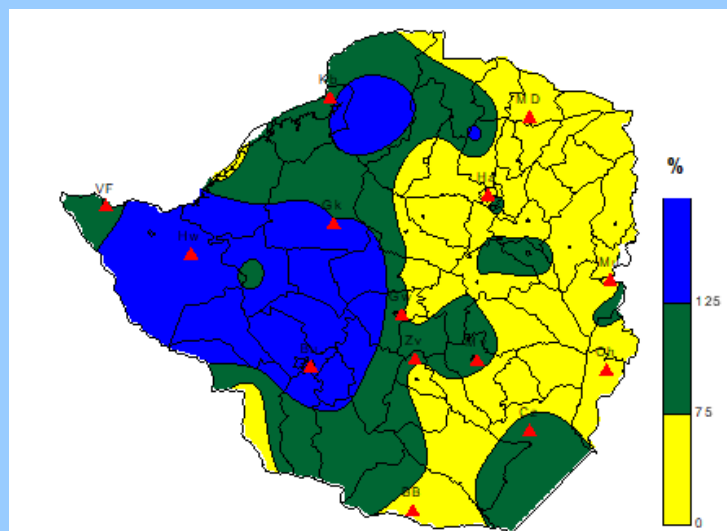


FIGURE 3: ACCUMULATION RAINFALL AS PERCENTAGE OF AVERAGE: 1 OCTOBER -12 NOVEMBER 2025

As shown in Figure 3, the eastern half of the country has received below-normal rainfall (yellow), for the period from 01 October to 11 November 2025. This was as a result of the dry conditions in October. Most of the northern half of the country received rainfall in the normal category (green). Wetter conditions were experienced in the bulk of Matabeleland North, parts of Matabeleland South, Midlands and Mashonaland West Provinces resulting in above-normal rainfall (blue) in these areas. However, the distribution of the rainfall has been patchy.

WEEKLY EVAPORATION 05 NOVEMBER 2025 - 12 NOVEMBER

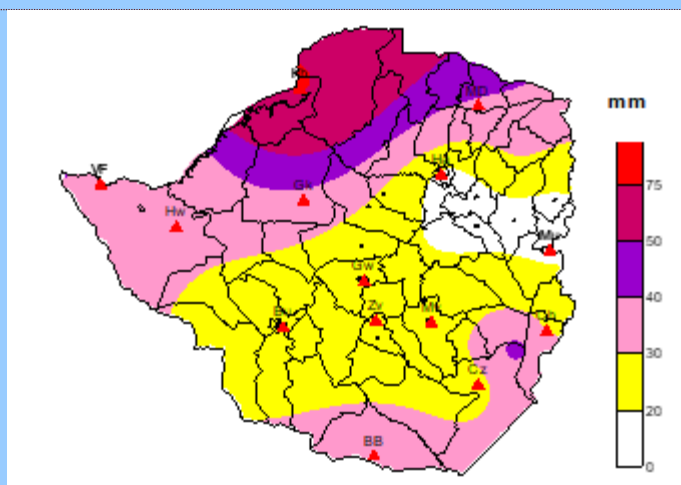


FIGURE 4: WEEKLY EVAPORATION: 05 NOVEMBER-12 NOVEMBER 2025

Figure 4 shows that high daytime temperatures in the extreme north of the country caused evaporation rates to exceed 50 mm. Elsewhere, evaporation was lower (below 30 mm) due to moist, cloudy conditions across the rest of the country.

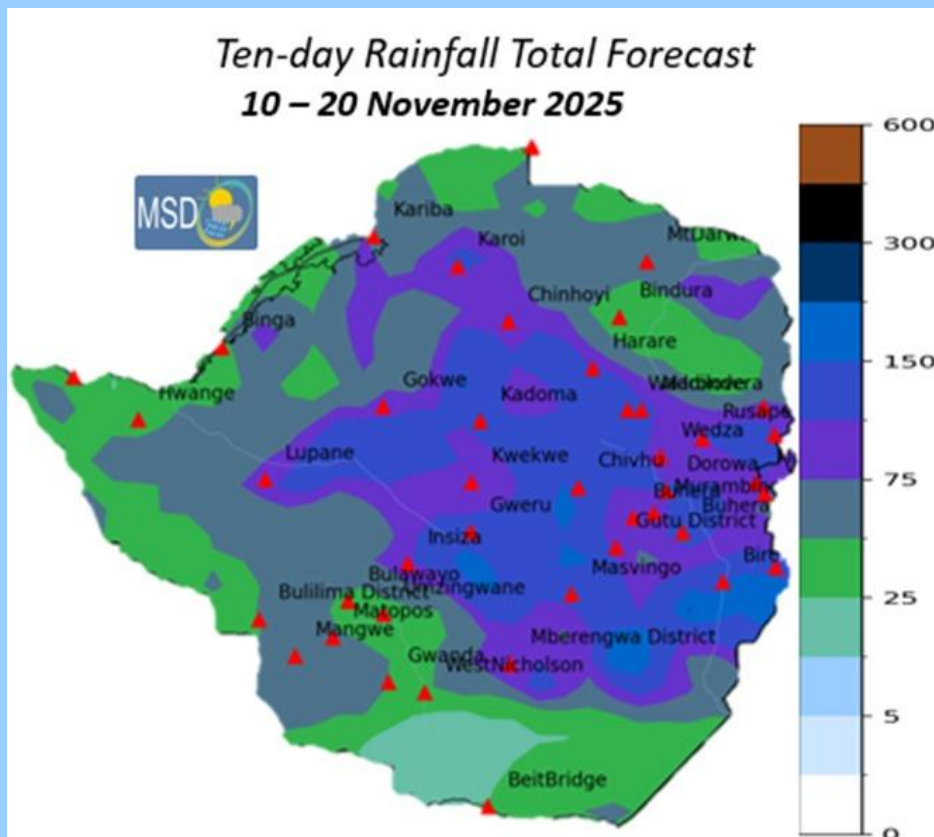


FIGURE 5: PRECIPITATION FORECAST: 13 NOVEMBER – 19 NOVEMBER 2025

Scattered thundershowers are forecast in parts of the country. Weekly totals of 25 mm to 50 mm are expected (Figure 5). Localized downpours are probable, particularly along the central watershed, where totals may exceed 75 mm.
