



10 DAY AGROMET BULLETIN

SUMMARY OF PAST DEKARD 01 TO 10 MARCH 2024

The highlight of the dekad was characterized by a cloud band that entered the country from the north. This was partly due to a low-pressure (vacuum) system in the Mozambique Channel (this later evolved into Moderate Tropical Storm Filipo). The moisture resulted in light isolated thundershowers in all Mashonaland Provinces and northern parts of Manicaland. This prevailed over most of the country resulting in widespread thundershowers and localized hailstorms.

Notable dekadal totals were recorded in Kariba which had 62.7mm, Guruve 60.2mm, Karoi 57.4mm and Victoria Falls 32.5mm. The rest of the areas received less than 20mm (Table 1).

WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR THE PERIOD 11 TO 20 MARCH 2024




Figure 1: Accumulated precipitation forecast for the period 01 to 09 March 2024 (courtesy of National Center for Environmental Prediction)

The Tropical Storm is not set to impact the country much. Only windy conditions and generally light showers are anticipated with heavier falls over the northern parts of the country having considerable rain.

 Mostly dry and hot conditions are expected during the forecast period. Dry conditions have persisted in most parts of the country since the end of January and this has had a great impact on the crop situation especially the late planted crops. Livestock farmers should also start working on supplementary feeding options available in their locality for example savaging the failed cereal crop for their livestock.
