



**SATELLITE-BASED GLANCE INTO TODAY,
FRIDAY 23 JANUARY 2026.**




Yesterday's thunderstorms resulted in the highest rainfall in the Western region. **West Nicholson and Matopos** received the highest rainfall of **22 mm**, followed by **Tsholotsho and Kezi with 20 mm**, **Victoria Falls with 19 mm**, and **Zvishavane with 11 mm**. The remaining areas recorded less than **10 mm** of rain.

Today, the southwestern parts of the country were mostly cloudy and mild, while the remaining parts of the country experienced partly cloudy and warm conditions for much of the day. Remnant moisture led to brief cloudy periods and isolated afternoon thundershowers in the western and southern regions of the country.



FORECAST FOR TOMORROW: SATURDAY 24 JANUARY 2026



Harare Metropolitan, Manicaland, Midlands, Bulawayo Metropolitan, Masvingo, Matabeleland North, northern parts of Matabeleland South and all Mashonaland Provinces:

Mostly cloudy and mild conditions in the morning, becoming cloudy and warm in the afternoon with scattered thunderstorms. Localized downpours are probable in places.


Southern parts of Matabeleland South Province:

Partly cloudy and warm conditions are expected for much of the day. Isolated showers, which may be thundery are likely in places.

Actions to Take:

- The public is advised to avoid crossing flooded rivers to prevent loss of life.
- Seek shelter in a safe building or hard topped vehicle to avoid lightning strikes.

WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR: SUNDAY 25 JANUARY 2026



Harare Metropolitan, Mashonaland Central, Mashonaland West, Midlands, Matabeleland North and Bulawayo Metropolitan Provinces:

Mostly cloudy and warm conditions will prevail for much of the day, with scattered afternoon thunderstorms. Localized heavy rainfall is possible in places.

Manicaland, Mashonaland East, Masvingo, Matabeleland South Province:

Mostly cloudy and mild at first becoming partly cloudy and warm as the clouds burn off, with a chance of isolated thundershowers in some areas.

Actions to Take:

- The public is advised to avoid crossing flooded rivers to prevent loss of life.
- Seek shelter in a safe building or hard topped vehicle to avoid lightning strikes.


