SATELLITE-BASED GLANCE INTO TODAY, SUNDAY 31 MAY 2026

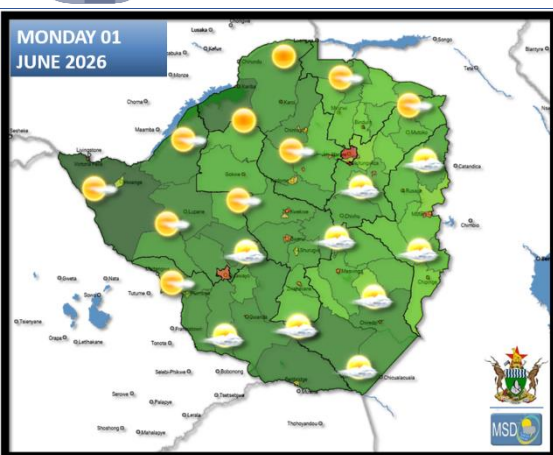


Cold conditions were experienced across much of the country this morning, with slight ground frost reported in **Matopos (2°C) and surrounding areas**. An influx of relatively cool southerly winds brought cloudy and windy weather to the southern and eastern parts of the country, while drizzle was recorded in Buffalo Range and Nyanga. As the day progressed, conditions became partly cloudy and mild over much of the country, while areas to the extreme west remained mostly sunny.

FORECAST FOR TOMORROW: MONDAY 01 JUNE 2026



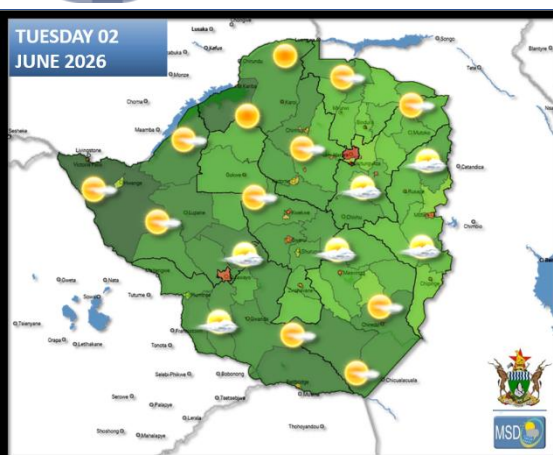
Matabeleland South, Bulawayo Metropolitan, southern parts of Midlands, Masvingo, Manicaland, Harare Metropolitan and southern parts of Mashonaland East provinces: Briefly cloudy and cold in the morning with a slight chance of drizzle in areas such as Gwanda and Chiredzi, becoming partly cloudy and mild by the afternoon. Cold overnight conditions.

Matabeleland North, Mashonaland West and Central, northern parts of Midlands and northern parts of Mashonaland East: Mostly sunny and mild for much of the day; though cold at first and towards evening.

Actions to Take:

- Ensure the young and elderly are kept warm especially in the morning and overnight.
- Keep warm; if a brazier or fire is used indoors to keep warm, ensure the room is well ventilated.

Matabeleland South, Bulawayo Metropolitan, southern parts of Midlands, northern parts of Manicaland, Harare Metropolitan and southern parts of Mashonaland East provinces: Partly cloudy and mild by day though cool both in the morning and towards evening.

Matabeleland North, Mashonaland West and Central, Masvingo, southern parts of Manicaland and northern parts of Mashonaland East: Cold morning conditions under mostly clear skies, becoming mild as the day progresses. It should be cold overnight.

Actions to Take:

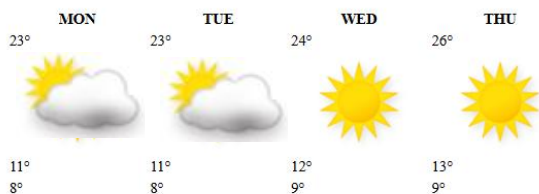
- Do not leave any fire unattended, whether indoors or outdoors.
- Monitor temperature within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from your local ABAO.



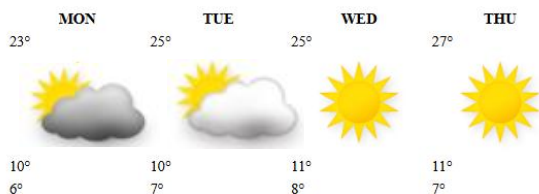
