SATELLITE-BASED GLANCE INTO TODAY, SATURDAY 13 JUNE 2026

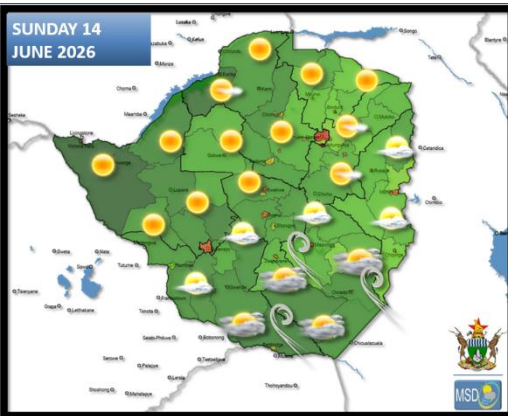


Cold, calm and clear morning skies resulted in severe ground frost in **Gweru (-3°C)**, moderate ground frost **Matopos (-2°C)** and **Nyanga (0°C)**, while areas such as **Gwanda (2°C)**, and **Nkayi (2°C)** had slight ground frost. By afternoon, mild conditions were experienced countrywide. However, relatively cool southerly winds moving inland from the southern coast of Africa led to windy conditions and scattered clouds over the south eastern districts of the country towards the evening.

FORECAST FOR TOMORROW: SUNDAY 14 JUNE 2026



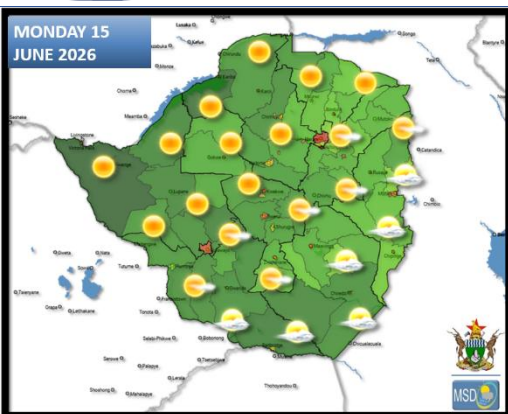
Matabeleland South, Bulawayo Metropolitan, southern parts of Midlands provinces, Masvingo and southern parts of Manicaland provinces: Windy and cool with brief cloudy periods in districts such as **Chiredzi, Chipinge, Mwenezi, Gwanda and Beitbridge.**

Matabeleland North, northern parts of Midlands, Harare Metropolitan, northern parts of Manicaland and all Mashonaland provinces: Cold in the morning with slight ground frost in **Nyanga, Henderson, Plumtree, Gweru, Chivhu, Mhondoro and Marondera.** Mostly sunny and mild by noon, becoming cold towards evening with a light breeze.

Actions to Take:

- Ensure the young and elderly are kept warm especially in the morning and overnight.
- Monitor temperature within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from your local Agricultural Business Advisory Officer

WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR: MONDAY 15 JUNE 2026



Matabeleland South, Masvingo and Manicaland provinces: Partly cloudy and mild for much of the day though cool in the morning. Cold conditions overnight.

Matabeleland North, Bulawayo Metropolitan, Midlands, Harare Metropolitan, and all Mashonaland provinces: Cold at first with a chance of slight ground frost over elevated areas. Mostly sunny and mild in the afternoon becoming cold overnight.

Actions to Take:

- Implement frost prevention measures where necessary, with advice from Agricultural Business Advisory Officer.
- Monitor temperature within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from your local Agricultural Business Advisory Officer.

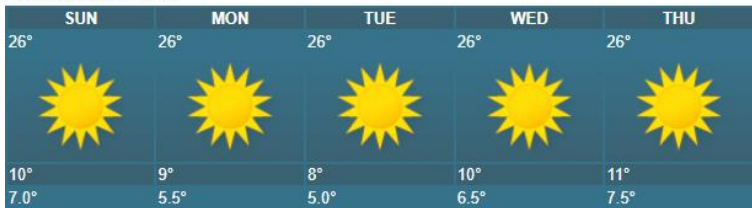
