10 DAY AGROMET BULLETIN

SUMMARY OF THE PAST DEKAD 20-05-2026 TO 31-05-2026

The review dekad was mainly characterised by mostly clear skies across the country, the average total cloud cover was 3 oktas or less in most places except for Mount Darwin which has 7 oktas. The southern parts of the country, Matabeleland South, Manicaland, Masvingo and Midland had cloudy, windy conditions towards the end of the dekad with some areas recording light drizzle. These places include Nyanga, Makoholi, Masvingo and Chisumbanje. In terms of the average wind speed for the dekad, it was generally light on average across the country with a south-easterly in the southern parts of the country while a northerly component prevailed in the northern areas.

The clear skies that prevailed in most of the review period resulted in the incidence of ground frost being recorded in areas such as Nkayi, Rupike, Nyanga and Gweru. Average sunshine hours amounted to 90 indicating the plenty of sunshine that was being enjoyed during the ten days.

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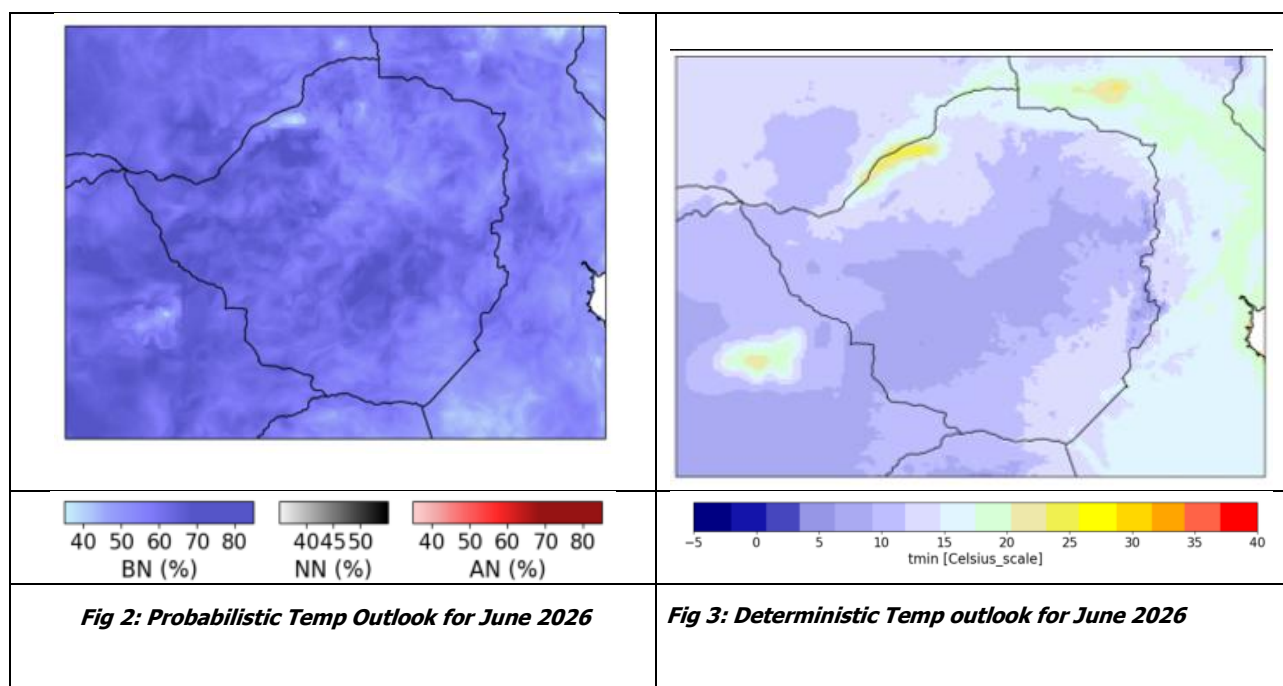

EXPECTED WEATHER: 01 JUNE -10 JUNE 2026

Clear to mostly clear with very low morning and night temperatures which should increase the chances of ground frost during the next ten days. Ground frost is likely in frost prone areas like Nyanga, Henderson, Gweru, West Nicholson, Lupane among those places along the high veld. The winds should be generally light with a south-easterly component in the southern parts and northerly component in the northern parts.

WEATHER OUTLOOK: JUNE 2026



In June 2026, the monthly temperature outlook indicates that cooler than normal conditions are expected across the country, as shown by the blue shading on the map in Figure 2. The actual expected minimum temperatures range from 7 °C and below in most parts of the country except for the Zambezi and Save valley where temperatures may be slightly higher than that. Chances of very low temperatures remains probable as the above are forecast average for June.
