



SATELLITE-BASED GLANCE INTO TODAY, WEDNESDAY 17 JUNE 2026



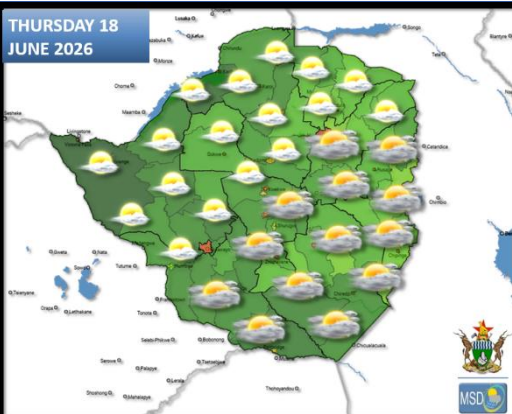
Clear skies and light winds overnight led to cold early morning conditions, with moderate frost in **Gweru** (1°C), **Matopos** (2°C), **Chivhu** (2°C), and **Henderson** (2°C). During the day, afternoon clouds developed as a cool, moist air mass advanced from the southeast. Meanwhile, the Zambezi Valley experienced sunny and cool conditions.

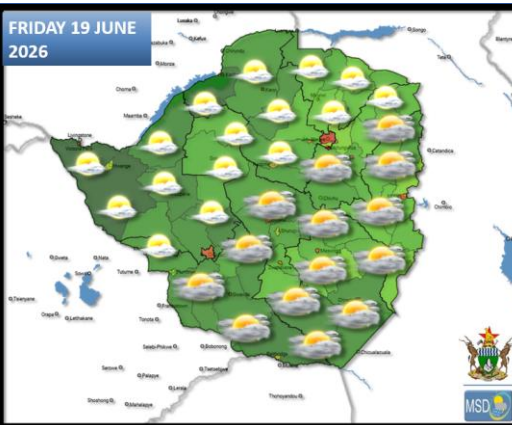
Partly cloudy and cold in the morning becoming warm as the day progresses.

Bulawayo Metropolitan, Matabeleland South, southern parts of Midlands, Masvingo, Manicaland and southern parts of Mashonaland East Provinces:

Slight chance of drizzle is expected with mostly cloudy and cold conditions in the morning. It should be mild by midday becoming cold towards evening.

Matabeleland North, northern parts of Midlands, Mashonaland West, Mashonaland Central, Harare Metropolitan and northern parts of Mashonaland East Provinces:

Partly cloudy and cold with a chance of slight ground frost in places. Becoming warm later in the day.

Actions to Take:



- Implement frost prevention measures where necessary, with advice from Agricultural Business Advisory Officer.
- Monitor temperature within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from your local Agricultural Business Advisory Officer.
