The day began cold under clear skies across much of the country. As a result, moderate ground frost occurred in **Matopos (-1°C)**, while slight ground frost occurred in **Nyanga (1°C)**.

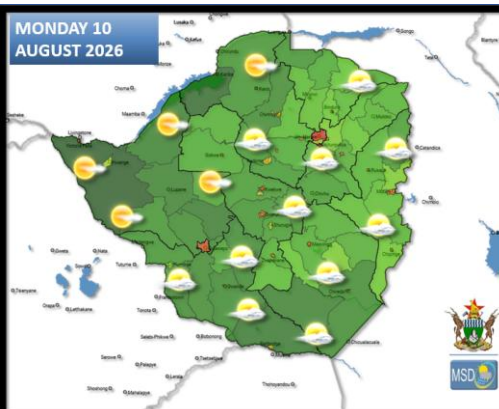


As the day progressed, partly cloudy conditions with light winds were experienced across the southern and eastern regions. Mild afternoon conditions prevailed in all areas before it became cold again towards the evening.

Matabeleland South, Bulawayo Metropolitan, Masvingo, southern parts of Midlands, Manicaland, Harare Metropolitan and Mashonaland East provinces:

Clear and cold at first with ground frost in areas such as **Nkayi, Matopos, Gweru, and Henderson**. Becoming partly cloudy, windy and mild in the afternoon. Cold conditions overnight.

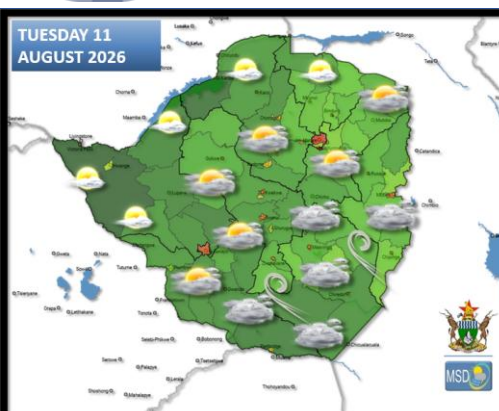
Matabeleland North, northern parts Midlands, Mashonaland West and Central provinces:

Mostly sunny and mild for much of the day. Cold both in the morning and at night. Slight ground frost is probable in **Lupane**.

Actions to Take:

- Implement frost prevention measures where necessary, with advice from your local Agricultural Business Advisory Officer (ABAO).
- Monitor temperatures within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from Agritex Officers.

WEATHER OUTLOOK FOR: TUESDAY 11 AUGUST 2026



Matabeleland South, Bulawayo Metropolitan, Masvingo, southern parts of Midlands, Manicaland, Harare Metropolitan and Mashonaland East provinces:

Cloudy, cool and windy for much of the day with a chance of light rain and drizzle in some areas. Cold conditions are expected in the morning and at night.

Matabeleland North, northern parts Midlands, Mashonaland West and Central provinces:

Partly cloudy and cold in the morning becoming cool in the afternoon. Light winds should be felt time and again.

Actions to Take:

- Monitor temperatures within fowl runs and adjust accordingly, with advice from Agritex Officers.
